THE NEW ENGLAND AND BERMUDA
DISTRICT OF KIWANIS INTERNATIONAL
FOR ADOPTION AT THE 2017
DISTRICT CONVENTION**

ARTICLE VII, Section 2a. ~~The Secretary and
Treasurer who will assume office on October 1
shall be appointed by the Governor-designate,
subject to the approval of the District Board-des-
ignate.~~ **The Secretary who will assume office
on October 1 shall be appointed by the
Governor-designate, subject to the approval of
the District Board-designate.**

**Section 2b. The Treasurer who will assume the
office on October 1 shall be appointed by the
Governor-designate, subject to the approval of
the District Board-designate. The position of
Treasurer shall be a three year term and have a
limit of two terms or six years. The process of
selecting a District Treasurer is described in
detail in the Policies of the New England and
Bermuda District of Kiwanis International
Section 3.30.**

Registration

To receive convention credit and to give us accurate attendance figures (which must be recorded and forwarded to Kiwanis International), all Kiwanians and their spouses or guests must register at the Registration Desk. Please register as early as possible.

The Registration Desk will be located in the Grand Ballroom foyer. It will be open Thursday, August 24 from 4:00 PM to 6:00 PM; Friday, August 25 from 8:00 AM to noon and from 1:00 PM to 4:00 PM; and Saturday, August 26 from 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon.

Certification of Delegates

Admission cards to the House of Delegates will be issued at the Credentials Desk to all certified Delegates and Delegates-at-Large. These cards are non-transferable and must be signed and surrendered before a ballot will be issued. Please obtain your credential card at the time of registration.

The Credentials Desk will be located in South Assembly. It will be open on **Friday, August 25 from 8 am to noon, and from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm, and on Saturday, August 26 from 8:00 am to noon and from 1:00 pm to 1:30 pm.**

Delegate Responsibilities

Every Kiwanis Club is entitled to three (3) delegates at the District Convention. As you have been selected as a delegate, you have the important responsibility of representing your club in all matters that affect the New England and Bermuda District. Your convention duties are of the utmost importance, and include:

- To attend PROMPTLY the 2:00 p.m. meeting of the House of Delegates Saturday, August 26.
- To study the qualifications of the candidates for District office.
- To vote according to your best judgment on the issues presented.
- To utilize every opportunity to gather information for your club.
- To present a complete convention report to your club.

At the meeting of the House of Delegates, resolutions and proposed amendments to the district's bylaws will be considered, and district officers for 2017-2018 will be elected. As a delegate, you are strongly urged to participate fully in this critical voting session.

Badges

Official convention badges have been provided for all delegates. Please wear your badge at all times for easy identification and admission to all sessions and functions.

Standing rules for the House of Delegates

Rule 1: Official delegate badges must be clearly displayed at all times. Only delegates with official delegate badges may be present in the House or speak on motions and vote.

Rule 2: Only delegates may be seated in the area designated for delegates.

Rule 3: The House of Delegates shall not be closed, but during the candidate question period only one candidate may be present in the House at a time.

Rule 4: Any main motion or amendment shall be written, signed by the maker and then seconded and presented to the District Secretary before it is moved.

Rule 5: No delegate may speak more than three minutes at a time unless allowed to do so by the orders of the day or by a majority vote of the delegates.

Rule 6: No delegate may address the assembly a second time on the same question until all delegates who desire to speak on the topic have spoken.

Rule 7: The maker of a motion shall be entitled to speak first in support of the motion or may immediately yield the floor to another delegate.

Rule 8: Delegates shall alternate between those speaking for and those speaking against a motion.

Rule 9: Microphones shall be designated by number. Speakers for the main motion shall use the odd numbered microphones, and speakers against the main motion shall use the even numbered microphones. The Chair will recognize microphones in rotating order.

Rule 10: A delegate shall not speak for or against a motion and move to close debate on the same recognition.

Rule 11: An assistant Sergeant-at-Arms shall be positioned at each microphone to relay to the chair priority motions such as point of order, point of information, etc.

Rule 12: Candidates for the office of Governor and Governor-Elect may have one nominating speech not to exceed three (3) minutes. All other candidates for district office shall have a nominating speech of two (2) minutes. There will be no seconding speeches, but a second to the

nomination must be made from the floor. Nominating speeches may not be waived.

Rule 13: A candidate question period shall follow the nominating speeches. Each candidate for Governor and Governor-Elect shall appear individually before the House of Delegates to respond to two questions applicable to their office. All candidates for the same office shall be asked the same question. A candidate shall have no more than three (3) minutes to respond to each question. During the Candidate Question Period only one candidate may be present in the House at a time.

Rule 14: Each person seeking endorsement as a candidate for International office may have one nominating speech not to exceed three (3) minutes and a seconding speech not to exceed one (1) minute.

Rule 15: After the nominating speeches, each person seeking endorsement as a candidate for International office will have the opportunity to address the Delegates for a period not to exceed three (3) minutes.

Rule 16: Any candidate who is unopposed for office may be elected by a voice vote.

Rule 17: Debate on any proposed resolution or By-Law amendment, including all amendments thereto, shall be limited to 45 minutes.

Rule 18: A motion to move the previous question will not be in order until 15 minutes of debate has taken place or all microphones are clear.

Rule 19: Any of the above rules may be suspended by majority vote.

Rule 20: Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised shall be the parliamentary authority on all matters of procedure not specifically covered by the Bylaws of The New England District of Kiwanis International and these standing rules.
